

The missionary report of Viktor Baglai

The first quarter of 2026

Greetings to you, dear brothers and sisters in the Lord!

My family and I sincerely thank you for your constant prayers and monthly financial support for our ministry in Ukraine. Your help is a great support for us during this difficult time.

The winter of 2025-2026 was one of the most difficult during the entire period of the full-scale invasion. Due to constant shelling of critical infrastructure, we faced a prolonged lack of heat and electricity during severe frosts. Even so, in the midst of darkness, the Lord worked through His Church.

Below we share with you the stories and photos of how God has blessed our ministry this winter:

- Supporting the families of fallen heroes.

The war has been going on for four years, and the number of people, who have lost their loved ones, unfortunately, is constantly growing. We hold support groups for widows, mothers, and children of fallen soldiers. During our meetings, we do not just distribute food packages, but we listen to their pain, pray, sing psalms, and share the Gospel of Jesus Christ (photo 1).



- Christmas for the children is a holiday of warmth and hope.

The Ukrainian children today live in extremely difficult conditions: sleepless nights in bomb shelters, cold at home and an unstable education. This year our Christmas holiday became a real island of safety for them. Thanks to the power generator, the House of Prayer was warm and bright. Many families came to us to warm up not only physically, but also spiritually, feeling the love of brothers and sisters (photo 2).



- National Prayer for Ukraine.

On February 24, 2026, on the fourth anniversary of the full-scale war, we united in joint prayer. Together with the pastors, brothers, and sisters from all over the Kyiv region, we gathered at the Church of the Temple of Peace. We thanked the Lord for His protection and asked for wisdom for the leadership of the state, strength for the military, doctors and rescuers. With a special trembling in my heart, I prayed for comfort for the families, who lost their loved ones (photo 3).
