What is Awana?

Awana is a global, nonprofit ministry with fully integrated evangelism and long-term discipleship programs for ages 2 to 18 that actively involves parents and church leaders. Each week, more than 3.7 million children and youth, 470,000 volunteers and 260 field staff take part in Awana in over 47,000 churches around the world. Offered through local churches, Awana reaches kids where they're at and walks alongside them in their faith journey. The name Awana stands for 'Approved Workmen Are Not Ashamed' from 2 Timothy 2:15.

Snow Days

- **Please Note:** “The weather policy is that even if schools are closed, the leadership will determine whether to cancel or not. This is determined between 3:00-5:00 PM. An e-mail will be sent out to let you know if there is a cancellation. Cancellation information will be on TV Channels 8 & 13 as well.”
- The email notification will be sent to the email address you provided on the registration form. Please be sure to check your spam folder.
- If you're unsure, please call someone on the Awana Leadership Team as the church secretary may not be in the office.
- In the event of a snow day, clubbers can record their section(s) on video and text it to the director or secretary of their club. This is only for snow days unless otherwise approved.

My child must stay home if..

MY CHILD SHOULD STAY HOME IF:



They have a fever of 100.4 or higher.



They have vomited in the past 24 hours.



They have had diarrhea in the past 24 hours.



They have an unidentified rash.



They have head lice.



They have an eye infection.

MY CHILD CAN RETURN WHEN:

They are free of fever 24 hours without fever reducing medication.

They are free of vomiting for 24 hours.

They are free of diarrhea for 24 hours.

Rash is cleared or a doctor has confirmed its not contagious.

They have been effectively treated and are free of lice and nits.

They have been treated at least 24 hours prior.

Club Rules

In order to have a safe, enjoyable, and orderly environment for all the children, our Awana Club has established some rules. Our leaders will enforce these rules, and it would be very helpful to us if you would remind your clubber that we expect them to be followed.

- Respect and obey your leaders and other staff members.
- Take part in the entire night unless you've brought a note from your parents or are excused by your club director.
- Remain with your leaders at all times during club.
- Remain in the church building at all times.
- Gym shoes are a must for safety reasons.
- No use of foul language or gestures.
- No kicking, hitting, tripping, rough housing, fighting, etc.
- Please do not bring balls/toys with you from home.

Security

The security of your children is very important to us. All of our workers have passed background checks and should always be wearing a shirt or name tag identifying them as Awana workers.

We welcome you to visit the club at any time; however, please do your best to not disturb the clubbers so the night can run with as few distractions as possible.

Check-In policy:

- All clubbers must be checked in by an approved adult each night of AWANA at the main double doors of the auditorium.
- This is required so we know who is in the building.

Check-Out policy:

- Cubbies must be checked out by an approved adult from the Cubbie room.
- Sparks and T&T Clubbers must be checked out by an approved adult at the main double doors of the auditorium.
- This is required so we ensure all clubbers return to their approved adults.

How You Can Help

Moms and Dads – You are important in helping your child enjoy the Awana program. Here are a few of our suggestions:

- Help your child attend Awana every week. Faithful attendance helps to build friendships, and enables the clubber to achieve awards.
- Be sure to arrive on time. Awana starts promptly at 6:45 (6:30 for T&T verse recitation). Please do not drop your child off before 6:30.
- Encourage your child to learn the Bible verses during the week at home. If they study consistently each week, they should be able to finish their book by the end of the year to earn their book award.
- Make sure your child wears their Awana uniform and brings their book and Bible each week. This instills a pride in their club and helps earn points for their teams.
- To ensure the safety of all children, please follow dismissal procedures for all clubs.
- Please pick your clubber up no later than 8:20.
- Make sure to have a permission form filled out for your child. This form must be filled out by the parent/guardian in order for the child to play games after his/her first week.

Nightly Schedule

All clubs meet on Wednesday evenings from 6:45 – 8:15pm with the exception of T&T verse recitation at 6:30. Please **do not drop your clubber off before 6:30**. This allows our directors and leaders to prepare and set up their rooms for the evening. If you do arrive early, it may be beneficial to take the time outside to review your child's verses with them.
